Create a puppet of a favorite character. Write a sentence or two that your puppet would say.	Read a myth. Make a list of the characters in the myth.	Create a picture ad on your favorite book for a magazine. Use a catchy slogan.	Create a daily comic strip about yourself or a fictional character. How many days can you go?
Make a picture timeline of the events in a book. Add labels.	Write a commercial for a favorite book to persuade a friend to read it.	Read a magazine from cover to cover.	Invent a board game based on an adventure book you have read. Don't forget rules and directions.
Create a collage with words and pictures about themes or characters in a book.	Create a scrapbook of your summer. Include photos, ticket stubs, and stories of things that happened.	Measure how long it takes an ice cube to melt outside in the sun, in the shade, in the fridge, and in an air-conditioned room.	Use a map to see where you'd be if you traveled 10 miles, 50 miles, 100 miles, or even 1000 miles from home.
Draw a colored cover for a book. Write important "book jacket" information inside.	Download an ebook to read at <a href="http://www.destiny.lexington4.net">www.destiny.lexington4.net</a> then choose FMIS and Folletshelf.	Illustrate a scene from a book you are reading.	Put a penny in a jar every time you read. Ask a parent to match your pennies with dimes.
Attend a Public Library program.	Plan a Dream Day -where to go, what to do, and what to eat. Don't forget to list costs involved.	Write about how you would handle a situation in a book differently from characters.	Design a T-shirt that promotes your book. Write a jingle to sell it.
Write a poem about summer, an event, or a favorite pet.	Plan a book picnic with a friend. Each of you share a chapter from the books you are reading.	Draw a portrait of a book's main character and then write a summary about the person.	Read outside for an hour.
Read a Tall Tale. (Try to write your own.)	Make your own joke book. Collect jokes and riddles from friends and family to include.	Stack cups, then draw a picture and write arrow codes. Have a friend try to stack the cups using your code.	Make a list of all the flavors of ice cream you can; put the list in ABC order. Try a different flavor each week.
Draw an empty head shape; fill it with words, symbols, or images that are bouncing around in the character's head.	Make a "Wanted Poster" for a book character. List physical description, what he/she did, important info, and the reward.	Look for shapes, designs, and patterns in the clouds. Draw pictures of them.	Find a new recipe. Make a list of ingredients and amounts. At the store check price options. Fix the recipe for your family.
Make a list of the 10 best things you did this summer.	Create a secret code and write a message to a friend. (example: A=1, B=2, C=3)	Make a list of words that describe fireworks bursting in the sky.	Plan a backyard camping trip with a friend. List the things you will need to <i>survive</i> .
